Describe a time you were in need and reached out to someone for help.

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

1. What was Jesus feeling? Does this surprise you? Why or why not?
2. Why do you think Jesus went off by Himself to pray?
3. Even in extreme anguish, Jesus surrendered to the will of the Father. What caused Him to surrender?
4. What are good things God calls us to do, which may require us to suffer?
5. Share about a time when someone suffered or sacrificed something to help you. How did you thank that person?
6. Verses 37-40 tell us that Jesus reached out to those closest to Him in His time of need. What are the benefits of helping each other?
7. How could you become a person others want to reach out to in times of need?

8. Have you ever thought that God has a unique plan for your life? What is God's purpose for you?
9. What are specific ways you're carrying out God's purpose for your life?
10. What will you have to give up (surrender) to make room to carry out God's plan for your life?
